It is always important to remember prayer is not a monologue but a dialogue between you and God. It is when we hear from Him we have really prayed. Up until then we have merely been talking in the direction of God. It is when He speaks and we listen prayer truly evolves to the depth of our soul and we are changed forever. <sup>REHIII</sup>
