

### THE APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in God the Father Almighty,  
Maker of heaven and earth.  
I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord,  
Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,  
And born of the virgin Mary.  
He suffered under Pontius Pilate,  
Was crucified, died, and was buried;  
He descended into hell.  
The third day he rose again from the dead.  
He ascended into heaven  
And is seated at the right hand of God the Father  
Almighty.  
From there he will come to judge the living and the  
dead.  
I believe in the Holy Spirit,  
The holy Christian church,  
**THE COMMUNION OF SAINTS,<sup>1</sup>**  
The forgiveness of sins,  
The resurrection of the body,  
And the life everlasting. Amen.

The scripture we start with is a picture of the church at its birth. These believers have come from all over the Roman empire originally to celebrate Passover and Pentecost but had been converted to follow Jesus. Now they are together as born again followers waiting for the return of Jesus. They literally expected it ANY day so they stay as close to the temple in Jerusalem as possible because they are expecting Jesus to return here, and they don't want to miss it. They believe that the world is about to change and Jesus will take over or will deliver them. So here together they wait on Him. A little confused, but all of them were confident Jesus is the Messiah, the Christ, the anointed one of God.

### The Church/Saints in Action

Acts 2.42 They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. 43 Everyone was filled with awe, and many wonders and miraculous signs were done by the apostles. 44 All the believers were together and had everything in common. 45 Selling their possessions and goods, they gave to anyone as he had need. 46 Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, 47 praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.

## The Church/Saints Ministry

Romans 12.3 For by the grace given me I say to every one of you: Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the measure of faith God has given you. <sup>4</sup>Just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, <sup>5</sup>so in Christ we who are many form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. <sup>6</sup>We have different gifts, according to the grace given us. If a man's gift is prophesying, let him use it in proportion to his faith. <sup>7</sup>If it is serving, let him serve; if it is teaching, let him teach; <sup>8</sup>if it is encouraging, let him encourage; if it is contributing to the needs of others, let him give generously; if it is leadership, let him govern diligently; if it is showing mercy, let him do it cheerfully.

- Why was this necessary for the early church in Jerusalem?

About 25 years later Paul wrote a letter to the church that was located in Rome. Here he is urging them to be dedicated to their call as Christians. The church has now been waiting almost three decades for Christ return. Paul is directing them how to be the church as they wait.

### The Church/Saints Living Choices

Romans 12.1 Therefore, I urge you, brothers, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God—this is your spiritual (reasonable) act of worship. <sup>2</sup>Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will.
