26 In that day this song will be sung in the land of Judah:

Prayer

⁷ The path of the righteous is level; (or straight)
you make level the way of the
righteous.

⁸ In the path of your judgments,
O LORD, we wait for you;
your name and remembrance
are the desire of our soul.

- ① IN THAT DAY is a time in the future showing how it is all planned and how it will end. Judah means praise or praised. Here it is not the nation but a place planned where THE RIGHTEOUS join in praise to God for His eternal salvation. Salvation is seen as a fortress for the believer protecting them from the enemy. IN THE PREVIOUS CHAPTER MOAB'S CITIES are destroyed, while here God's cities stand.
- ② THE GATES OF THE HOLY CITY ARE OPEN FOR THE SAVED. (YOUNG II. p20) says the city is empty and waiting the arrival of the Saved. IT is a place without fear as the gates are open and only the righteous know the way or may enter. Here is the heavenly Zion of eternal peace.
- ③ This promise to the individual. Jesus spoke of such peace (Jn 14:27) This is a personal peace over the world. No matter what is happening. The condition of this peace is dependent upon a relationship w/God. You is referring to God and His peace for the believer.
- ④ Don't lose hope in what He has promised. God is an unmovable Rock. Mat 16:13-18 this [rock] is the truth that Jesus is the Son-of-God and the promised Messiah Israh is referring to.
- ⑤ In contrast to the strong city (of God) in verse (1) here the city of sinners is merely a lofty city. This city is not safe and its walls do not protect and its gates are not open but lay low to the ground. To humble them He reduces their fortress. Since they are trusting in physical strength God reduces them to fear w/out protection.
- ⑥ Here those from the "strong city" (verse 1) trample those who are driven from the "lofty city" (verse 5). These the world sees poor and needy are the army of God marching to victory.
- ⑦ God smooths out the bumps and removes turns so that the righteous find their way more easily and know the way set before them by God. Here obstacles that hinder the ungodly do not stop His children.
- ⑧ Life's path leads to God. Though the righteous & ungodly both arrive at the same place (Judgment) the outcome for them is very different. On this path Israh places himself with the judgment in the future. Here the righteous anticipate meeting God while the wicked ignore or deny what is coming. Here is a reflection of Exodus 3:15b "This is my name forever, and this is my memorial unto all generations - see also Ps. 30:4 To know and be with the one whose name is the very pleasure of life is the path to victory and glory.

Prayer

9 My soul yearns for you in the night;
my spirit within me earnestly seeks you.
For when your judgments are in the earth,
the inhabitants of the world learn
righteousness.

10 If favor is shown to the wicked,
he does not learn righteousness;
in the land of uprightness he deals corruptly
and does not see the majesty of the LORD.

11 O LORD, your hand is lifted up,
but they do not see it.
Let them see your zeal for your people, and be
ashamed.

Let the fire for your adversaries consume them.

12 O LORD, you will ordain peace for us,
for you have indeed done for us all our works.

13 O LORD our God,
other lords besides you have ruled over us,
but your name alone we bring to remembrance.

14 They are dead, they will not live;
they are shades, they will not arise;

- ⑨ Isaiah starts out speaking for himself. Day & Night he wants to know God and experience His presence. Isaiah not only yearns for God, he also put personal effort by living to find God and God's will. He then points out that the judgments of God. His intervening in life cause those who do not follow God to be aware of their sins and to at least learn or acknowledge another way.
- ⑩ When life is good the wicked do not acknowledge God. They focus on success and happiness while ignoring God. THE WICKED grow more wicked and unjust because they are blinded by worldly pleasures, personal powers and are blinded to the truth of God and His desires to help them move beyond the physical and discover the deeper life WITH Him.
- ⑪ God raises His hand, or is preparing to act. Yet, the wicked do not see what God is about to do. They are secure in themselves. Isaiah asks God to open their eyes to truth of how much God loves His people. Unless the wicked change they will be consumed.
- ⑫ Speaking directly to God, Isaiah again sees a future of peace for the people of God. As with much of Isaiah they see it in the physical while it will be ultimately a spiritual peace separated from sin and the unrighteous. Isaiah sees all that happens to believers as works we do for God.
- ⑬ Other lords is speaking of earthly rulers who have come and gone. Their names are forgotten, only the name of God is forever.
- ⑭ Isaiah emphasises they are mere men who have died and will not return. God has dealt with them so thoroughly they are forgotten entirely. God has blotted them out. THE VERSE IS NOT inferring the destruction of their souls, but of their bodies. JESUS was clear that the unrighteous are punished eternally. (Mt 25:46) The wicked are forgotten (vs. 14) while God is remembered (vs. 13).
- ⑮ Here is about more than numbers. THE VISION IS OF A GROWING nation, an expansion. It will be more than Judah & ISRAEL. It will also include the Gentiles. THE JEWISH people have never seen this goal of God. PETER WAS FORCED TO SEE IT. Acts 10:11 & 34.
- ⑯ Shows that discipline brings the people back to God. A whispered prayer is from someone who is afraid to speak but needs help and can only in the quietest voice call on God. IT is a prayer like Hannah when she prayed and no one could hear even though her mouth moved. THIS IS PRAYER DEEP FROM THE HEART heard like a shout in heaven's throne room.

17 Like a pregnant woman

who writhes and cries out in her pangs
when she is near to giving birth,
so were we because of you, O LORD;
we were pregnant, we writhed,
but we have given birth to wind.

We have accomplished no deliverance in the earth,

The Redemption of Israel

27 In that day the LORD with his hard and great and
strong sword will punish Leviathan the fleeing serpent,

(17) The pain of a pregnant woman is inescapable. It has a cause that cannot be undone. The pain precedes the birth. Isaiah says the people are like the women

(18) The pain is inescapable but the nation will show no results. It's

pain results in wind. Wind cannot be held or shared.
Their pain is useless. When a child is born people rejoice and the mother's pain is replaced with the love of a child. The people thought their pain and suffering would bring freedom and joy. Their suffering was merely a preparation for more suffering. Isaiah describes wind as tools in Isa. 4:29

(26) Is. 19 is improperly translated*. The Interlinear Bible shows the correct translation & purpose of this verse. His resurrection is our Resurrection.

*only one that translated correctly is the KJV.

(Isaiah 9:5 also references this burning away or burnt offering.)

(20) Here they are called my people. They are to enter their chambers and by extension pray and wait for God's anger to pass. Here we see Matthew 6 where Jesus instructed us to enter our room, shut the door and pray, and God would answer. This locking oneself away to seek God while avoiding His wrath is a Biblical truth. Here they as a nation are instructed to hide away and seek God's forgiveness, mercy, and guidance. Only God can deliver the people from God.

(21) Having taken refuge in God the Lord is going to bring justice and judgment upon the earth. This coming judgment will punish everyone not safe within their rooms with the blood on the doorknob. (Exodus R. 21-28) Here is a picture of the final judgment where all sin symbolized as shed blood soaks up. By the earth will be judged. Starting with Abel's blood to the last sinful death, all will be judged.

(1) Speaking of judgment at the end of time the sword of God Rev. 1:16 the double edge comes from Jesus mouth. His word & truth will punish Leviathan. (Rev. 14:14 has many heads.) just as the dragon does in Rev. 12:3. The serpent first seen in Genesis 3:1 and finally is dealt with in final judgment in Revelation. All three names are equated with the enemy who God will finally punish at the end of time. Satan is already defeated, (Luke 10:18) and God has prepared hades for him. (Mt 25:41)
