



This week, we are looking at the difference between the physical kingdom of the Old Testament and the spiritual kingdom of the New Testament. The phrases Kingdom of God and Kingdom of Heaven are interchangeable.

MONDAY: Read Matthew 13.31-33, 44. Why do you think Jesus used parables to describe the Kingdom? How do these help us understand the kingdom? What kingdom truths are found here? TUESDAY: Read Matthew 6.33 and John 3.3. What priority does God put on the kingdom? Why do you think this is so important to God? How should this change how we live our lives? WEDNESDAY: Read Romans 14.17 &1 Corinthians 15.50-52 & Revelation 22.1-5. Progressively, what do we learn about our relationship and entering the Kingdom of God/heaven?

This week, we will also examine the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah and how Isaiah used them as an example of a nation sinning against God.

THURSDAY: Background Read Genesis 13.11-13; 18.22-33; 19.1-11. What do we learn about Sodom and Gomorrah from these sections of scripture? Read Genesis 19.23-25. What happened to Sodom and Gomorrah? Why did this happen? FRIDAY: National sins exposed. Read Ezekiel 14–50. According to Ezekiel, what were the three sins of Sodom and Gomorrah? How did they demonstrate their sinful ways?

SATURDAY: Judah's sins and God's response. Read Isaiah 1.2-20 Vss. 2-8 How does God see the nation of Judah? Vss. 9 If they keep going like this, what is going to happen to them? Vs. 11-20, What are the people doing that they think will save them? What does God want them to do? Read Isaiah 3.9. How is Judah like Sodom? How will God respond?
