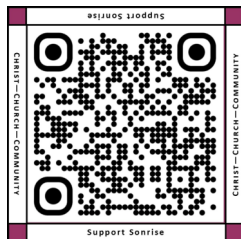

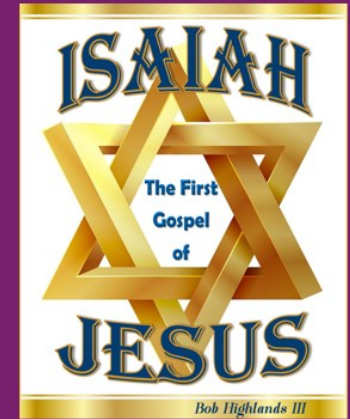

MONDAY: Read Isaiah 24.1-23 This section may refer to the end of time or just to the judgment upon the nation of Judah. In either case, how does God deal with the righteous? The Wicked?

TUESDAY: Read Isaiah 25.1-12 What promise can we find for believers in this section of Scripture?

WEDNESDAY: Read Isaiah 26.1-21 How is the faith of the believer rewarded and the life of the unrighteous punished?

THURSDAY: Read Isaiah 27.1-13. The vineyard in verses 2-5 represents God’s people and the church. Focusing on verse 6, how is this a promise of Jesus’ ministry through the church?

FRIDAY: Today, we are looking at verses in Isaiah 28.1 through Isaiah 33.24. In the following section, the ESV Bible translates the word WOE as AH. (This seems strange to me, but they do it anyway.) In the following verses, what are the six WOES or AHS? Isaiah 28.1; 29.1 (note that Ariel is a prophetic name for Jerusalem); 29.15; 30.1; 31.1; 33.1 (here, the destroyer is Assyria, who took Israel or the Northern Kingdom captive).

SATURDAY: What have you learned from studying Isaiah so far? Why is Isaiah essential to your spiritual growth and understanding of the ministry of Jesus?

- ◆ Vss. 17 “I am stirring up the Medes against them..”
