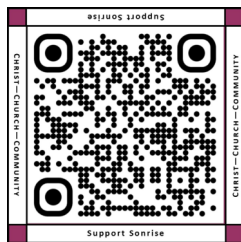

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**The FIVE Servant Songs of Isaiah**

- ◆ The servant songs or poems speak of a \_\_\_\_\_ who is placed in the position of representing the people before God.
  1. Isaiah 42:1–9 The servant is introduced
  2. Isaiah 49:1–13 The servant’s mission and conquest
  3. Isaiah 50:4–11 The servant’s surrender to God’s will
  4. Isaiah 52:13—53:12 The Suffering Servant death and victory
  5. Isaiah 61.1-11 The servat reconciles humanity to God.
- ◆ The \_\_\_\_\_ represents a revealing prophecy about the Messiah who suffers, dies, and resurrects for the sins of humanity.
- ◆ Modern Jewish theology sees the \_\_\_\_\_ as the nation of Israel, enduring prolonged suffering and repeated injustice.

**The Suffering Servant FORM**

- ◆ Isaiah 52.13 through 53.12 is a Jewish poem written in free verse. The lines are of different lengths and do not rhyme.
- ◆ There are five stanzas of three sections or lines each.
- ◆ The first line tells us the subject of the stanza with details to follow.

- ◆ The details are everywhere and can easily be overlooked if you do not take the time to look carefully and deeply. Words speak volumes.
- ◆ Here is a detailed description of the ministry, suffering, death, and resurrection of the Servant of the Lord.

**The Suffering Servant Song**  
**Stanza ONE the INTRODUCTION**

- ◆ Isaiah 52:
- ◆ [13] Behold, My servant will prosper,  
He will be high and lifted up and greatly exalted.
- ◆ [14] Just as many were astonished at you, My people,  
So, His appearance was marred more than any man  
And His form more than the sons of men.
- ◆ [15] Thus He will sprinkle many nations,  
Kings will shut their mouths on account of Him;  
For what had not been told them they will see,  
And what they had not heard they will understand.

**COMING SOON**

- ◆ Isaiah 52: [13] \_\_\_\_\_, MY \_\_\_\_\_ will prosper,  
He will be high and lifted up, greatly exalted.
- ◆ \_\_\_\_\_: Everything that follows is important. Here is the advance notice of what is coming. The coming attractions are about to be shared, and you will not want to miss it. This is declaration to \_\_\_\_\_ to what is about to be \_\_\_\_\_.
- ◆ MY SERVANT: This is the word for servant, bondservant, or slave. They are there to follow orders and to \_\_\_\_\_ THEIR \_\_\_\_\_ without thought of themselves. It is much like a marine storming a beachhead. It is about following orders given by someone in authority. This is the \_\_\_\_\_ you need to pay attention to.



This week, we are starting the Servant songs of Isaiah. Monday and Tuesday will follow up on Sunday, and then Wednesday through Saturday will be on the first Servant Song in Isaiah 42.1-9, where the Servant is introduced.

**MONDAY:** Read Psalm 22. How many of the prophecies in Psalm 22 can you find? John 19.23-24; Matthew 27.39; Matthew 27.43 & 26.39; Mark 15.34; John 19.30; John 19.34; John 19.28; Matthew 27.35; John 19.33; Matthew 27.35

**TUESDAY:** Can you find the following prophecies in Isaiah 53.1-12? Philippians 2.8-11; 1 Peter 2.24; Luke 23.44-48; Matthew 27.38; Matthew 26.65-68 Matthew 26.63; Romans 3.10-18; Matthew 28.20; Matthew 8.17; Matthew 26.67-68; Luke 2.7; John 1.10-12

**The FIRST SERVANT SONG**

**WEDNESDAY:** Read the first Servant Song in Isaiah 42.1-9. How does this servant song relate to the Baptism of Jesus? See Matthew 12.18-21. Why is this significant in the life and ministry of Jesus?

**THURSDAY:** Read the first servant song in Isaiah 42.1-9. According to vs. 6-7 What do we learn about the servant's character? What do we learn about His mission?

**FRIDAY:** Read the first servant song in Isaiah 42.1-9. Vs. 2 has two possible meanings. What are they? See Mark 1.44 & Luke 23.9. Why would Jesus tell people to be silent about Him? Why did he say nothing before Pilate?

**SATURDAY:** Read the first servant song in Isaiah 42.1-9. Vs. 9 What are the former things God is referring to? How is Jesus the fulfillment of NEW THINGS being declared by God?

\_\_\_\_\_ OF \_\_\_\_\_ , who through the eternal Spirit offered Himself without blemish to God, cleanse your conscience from dead works to serve the living God?

- ◆ See also Leviticus 16.14-15 Shows the purpose of this sprinkling of \_\_\_\_\_ to cleanse from sin.

### **Results Continued**

- ◆ Isaiah 52: [15] Thus He will sprinkle many nations, \_\_\_\_\_ will shut their mouths on account of HIM; For what had not been told them THEY WILL SEE, and what they had not heard THEY WILL UNDERSTAND.
- ◆ Here we turn again from the servant who suffers and dies to the results of \_\_\_\_\_ payment for the sins of humanity.
- ◆ \_\_\_\_\_ represents those who are not normally silenced. All will submit to \_\_\_\_\_, either in this life or in the next. His position of being EXALTED is cemented here over anyone and everyone.
- ◆ THEY WILL \_\_\_\_\_ : Ephesians 3.4-6 & Isaiah 6.4 as quoted in 1 Corinthians 2.8-10
- ◆ THEY WILL \_\_\_\_\_ : Here the \_\_\_\_\_ ministry comes to full fruition. Romans 16.25-26 “Has been MADE KNOW to all nations!”



### **KEY FACTS week eight**

1. Key FACT: God wants us to see ( \_\_\_\_\_ ) JESUS ministry ( \_\_\_\_\_ ), mission ( \_\_\_\_\_ UP), and majesty ( \_\_\_\_\_ ).
2. Key FACT: Each of us should be devastated ( \_\_\_\_\_ ) at what each of our sins cost Jesus.
3. Key FACT: through HIS sacrifice all humanity ( \_\_\_\_\_ ) can now come to God. This message of redemption/salvation bring us to the choice to accept and submit to HIM as our Savior & Lord now or come before HIM without hope later.

### **PROSPER**

- ◆ Isaiah 52: [13] Behold my servant \_\_\_\_\_ , He will be high and lifted up, greatly exalted.
- ◆ \_\_\_\_\_ : Carries significant and eternal meaning
  1. He will be successful in \_\_\_\_\_ His mission.
  2. He will pay the price necessary to \_\_\_\_\_ humanity.
  3. He will \_\_\_\_\_ the nations as God has promised.
- ◆ Isaiah 11.12 And He will **lift up a standard for the nations** And \_\_\_\_\_ the banished ones of Israel, And will \_\_\_\_\_ the dispersed of Judah **From the four corners** of the earth.

### **HIGH**

- ◆ Isaiah 52: [13] Behold my servant will prosper He will be \_\_\_\_\_ and lifted up, greatly exalted.
- ◆ \_\_\_\_\_ : This is the first position we see of the servant of God. This is His three years of \_\_\_\_\_ where He is:
  - ◇ the \_\_\_\_\_ to the disciples and the people.
  - ◇ The \_\_\_\_\_ or the master who guides them.
  - ◇ The \_\_\_\_\_ who listens to all the request.
  - ◇ The \_\_\_\_\_ who filled their needs.
  - ◇ He was misidentified as John the Baptist, Elijah, Jeremiah or another prophet. Mt. 16.13-16
  - ◇ This is where Peter declares Jesus is “THE \_\_\_\_\_ , the Son of the Living God.”

- ◆ Here we see the \_\_\_\_\_ of Jesus.

### **LIFTED UP**

- ◆ Isaiah 52: [13] Behold my servant will prosper He will be high and \_\_\_\_\_ , greatly exalted.
- ◆ \_\_\_\_\_ : The reference here is both a backward glance and a revealing prophecy about the future.

- ◆ The people had sinned, and serpents (snakes) were biting and killing them. Moses appealed to God for help. “Then the LORD said to Moses, “Make a fiery serpent and mount it on a pole. When anyone who is bitten looks at it, he will live.” Numbers 21.8
- ◆ “As Moses \_\_\_\_\_ the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of Man be \_\_\_\_\_ ; so that whoever believes will in Him have eternal life. John 3.14-15
- ◆ This is Jesus’ sacrificial death on the cross where He is \_\_\_\_\_ to suffer and die for our sins.

### **Greatly EXALTED**

- ◆ Isaiah 52: [13] Behold my servant will prosper He will be high and lifted up, \_\_\_\_\_ .
- ◆ \_\_\_\_\_ : Philippians 2.9-11 Therefore, GOD \_\_\_\_\_ HIM to the place of \_\_\_\_\_ honor and gave him the name \_\_\_\_\_ **ALL OTHER NAMES**, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.
- ◆ 1 Timothy 6.15 “He who is the blessed and **ONLY** \_\_\_\_\_ , the King of kings and Lord of lords..”
- ◆ Acts 5.31 “He is the one whom **GOD** \_\_\_\_\_ **TO HIS RIGHT HAND** as a Prince and a Savior,

### **ASTONISHED**

- ◆ Isaiah 52: [14] Just as many were \_\_\_\_\_ at **YOU**, My people, So, His appearance was marred more than any man And His form more than the sons of men.
- ◆ \_\_\_\_\_ : This is not like being pleasantly surprised, the word means to be \_\_\_\_\_ or \_\_\_\_\_. The thought is the people must look away because it bothers them so much.

- ◆ Isaiah is setting them up to see what they don’t want to see. He is about to show them something that will make them physically sick to look at.

### **HIS FORM**

- ◆ Isaiah 52: [14] Just as many were astonished at you, \_\_\_\_\_ So, His \_\_\_\_\_ was marred more than any man And His \_\_\_\_\_ more than the sons of men.
- ◆ \_\_\_\_\_ : This is a direct result of the Roman punishment before crucifixion. Mark 15.15-21
- ◆ \_\_\_\_\_ : He is transformed or \_\_\_\_\_ by this beating. He is beaten with a cat-of-nine tails. His beard is pulled out. He is pummeled so his eyes are swelled shut and his face is a mass of blood and bruises that have caused it to swell and remove any way of recognizing him.
- ◆ According to Isaiah this is the worst beating anyone has ever had to endure. Jesus knows in advance, before he came, what was going to happen.

### **Results**

- ◆ •Isaiah 52: [15] Thus He will \_\_\_\_\_ many nations, Kings will shut their mouths on account of Him; For what had not been told them they will see, And what they had not heard they will understand.
- ◆ •He both our priest and our sacrifice. Sprinkling HIS own blood to forgive and remove our sins.
- ◆ •Hebrews 9.13-14 (**TEMPORARY CLEANSING/ FORGIVENESS**) For if the blood of goats and bulls and the ashes of a heifer \_\_\_\_\_ those who have been defiled sanctify for the cleansing of the flesh, (**PERMENANT CLEANSING/FORGIVENESS**) how much more will the
