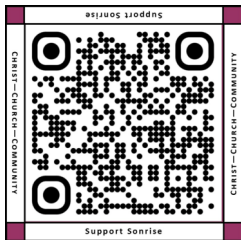

This week, we are looking at the Trichotomy of Man.

This deals with the three-part nature of humans as created by God. Each day, we will look at an aspect of this as found in the Bible. This three-part nature consists of Body, Mind (spirit), and Soul. Read the scripture and see if you can answer the question. This three-part nature is based on 1 Thessalonians 5.23.

MONDAY: Read Genesis 3.1-6. What are the three temptations Eve saw in verse 6? How can these three be seen as particular to our Trichotomous or three-part nature?

TUESDAY: Read Matthew 4.1-10. The devil tempted Jesus three times. How are these similar to the temptations of Eve? How is each one particular to the nature of Man? Which temptation is the one that affects the soul directly?

WEDNESDAY: Read Ezekiel 16.49. We often associate the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah with sexual sin. This is true of many who lived there, but the city (nation) had three particular sins. What were they, and how do they relate to the three-part nature of man?

THURSDAY: Read Mark 4.3.19. In verse 19, what are the three temptations a person faces that keep them from God? How are these like those faced by Jesus and Eve?

FRIDAY: Read 1 Timothy 1.5. What three things must a loving Christian maintain as part of their character? How can the following verses help us understand this? Luke 4.4, Luke 4.12, Matthew 6.33?

SATURDAY: Read John 16.5-11. What are the three ways the Holy Spirit convicts the sinful and the righteous? How is each one related to the three part nature of man?
