

**This week's we are focused on the PROMISE of JOY!** Each of the stories this week deals with a type of Joy.

**MONDAY** —Read The Birth of Jesus: The Joy of Christmas (Luke 2:8-20) Who is joyful in this story? How is their joy different? How is it a shared common Joy? How does this story bring Joy in our modern times?

**TUESDAY**—Read The Wedding at Cana: The Joy of a Miracle (John 2:1-11) How does this miracle demonstrate Jesus' desire for the joy of the believer? How does the presence of Christ at the wedding change everything? How can this be applied to our lives as believers?

**WEDNESDAY**—Read The Story of the Prodigal Son: The Joy of Reconciliation (Luke 15:11-32) What sorrow do we witness in this story? Reconcile means to mutually change. How are the key characters in the story changed for the better? How should this help us in accepting those returning to Christ?

**THURSDAY**—Read The Samaritan Woman at the Well: The Joy of Transformation (John 4:1-42) Why was the woman sorrowful? Why was the woman filled with Joy? What was the key to her Joy and transformation? How can such joy change others?

**FRIDAY**—Read The Healing of the Paralytic: The Joy of a Best Friend Healed. (Mark 2:1-12) How were others involved in bringing joy to the paralytic? What key lessons do we learn here in helping others find joy?

**BONUS** - Read The Conversion of Zacchaeus: The Joy of Salvation (Luke 19:1-10). In what ways did Jesus provide joy to Zacchaeus? What should we learn from this about how to share joy with others? How is such joy contagious?
