

This week takes us to the edge of life and a look into eternity. It also challenges us to live our lives in a different manner as believers and followers of Christ. It is time to dig deeper and put on your thinking caps.

<u>Monday</u>: Read Luke 16.19-31 What key facts can we learn about life after death from this account? What do we learn about judgment from this account?

<u>Tuesday</u>: Read 1 Corinthians 15.35-50 What do we learn here about the different types of bodies and their purposes?

<u>Wednesday</u>: Read 1 Corinthians 15.51-58 What do we learn about physical and spiritual bodies? How are believers to live their lives, and why?

<u>Thursday</u>: Read 1 Corinthians 15.12-28 What is Paul's argument for believing in the Resurrection? Why is the resurrection vital for the Christian faith and church?

Friday: Read Romans 6.15-19 What is the key point Paul is trying to make concerning being a slave? How are the two types of slaves mentioned here different? How are they the same?

<u>BONUS</u>: Read Matthew 25.1-13 Jesus told parables for us to learn from. What can we learn from the parable of the Ten Bridesmaids about living for Jesus and being ready for the end of life? What happens to those who are not ready?
